Frequently Asked Questions

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Eligibility

I have not yet obtained my PhD degree. Can I still apply?

No, you should have obtained your PhD by the time of application.

I have obtained my PhD more than 3 years ago. Am I still eligible to apply?

In principle, no. This fellowship targets recent PhDs, who are keen to start their career in academia. In cases of *force majeure*, however, applicants who have completed their PhDs more than three years prior to the date of application will be considered. These will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The applicant is advised to contact the ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit (at grants@theacss.org) prior to applying and submit a detailed statement explaining the circumstances surrounding his/her particular case and why is it a case of *force majeure*. Cases of *force majeure* include, but are not limited to:

- Prolonged illness
- Maternity/paternity leave
- War and/or humanitarian crisis
- Other special circumstances

Though such cases may be considered, applicants cannot have obtained their PhDs more than 7 years prior to the date of application.

Will the ACSS only fund applicants based in the region?

Yes and no. The Early Career Fellows Program generally targets scholars based in the region. However, it also encourages Arab scholars based abroad/with foreign training to return to the region. Therefore, if you are based outside the region at the time of application, you are expected to return to the region for the period of your fellowship. Furthermore, we encourage mobility within the region and therefore for scholars based in the region, preference will be given to those intending to move to another location for the duration of the Fellowship. Fellows must move to an institution other than the one that they are based in at the time of the application.

Does the ACSS have any geographical restrictions or preferences as to where the applicant should be based within the Arab region?

No. The ACSS funds applicants based anywhere in the region as well as those intending to commute between one or two countries in the region.¹

The Call for Applications specifically mentions the social sciences. Will you consider proposals from researchers in the humanities?

Yes, the ACSS employs a broad definition of the social sciences that includes any discipline in the social sciences and humanities and allied and interdisciplinary fields. Core disciplines include anthropology, demography, economics, history, political science, psychology, sociology, philosophy, literary studies and art history. Allied and interdisciplinary fields include architecture, geography, education, law, public health, gender studies, cultural studies, media studies, development studies and urban studies.

Applicants from the humanities, including literature, cultural studies, history, philosophy and the arts can also apply to this program.

What is the expected duration of research?

The duration of the ACSS Early Career Fellowship is 12 months. Once accepted, fellows will be expected to start their fellowships by June 1, 2022 (at the earliest). Later starting dates can be approved on a case-by-case basis.

Am I eligible to apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship if I am from an Arab country but not “Arab”?

Yes, as long as you have citizenship in an Arab country (or residence in an Arab country in the case of ‘citizenless’ refugees).

¹ By the ‘region’ we mean the following countries: Algeria, Bahrain, Comoros, Djibouti, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Mauritania, Morocco, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.

Am I eligible to apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship if I am a citizen of an Arab country but am living abroad, outside of the Arab region?

Yes, as long as you have proof of Arab Citizenship. You are expected to spend the whole period of your ACSS Early Career Fellowship within the Arab region. Furthermore, applicants who already have tenure-track/tenured positions or access to research resources *outside* the region are *not* eligible to apply.

Am I eligible to apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship if I am originally from an Arab country, or my parents/ancestors were from an Arab country but I no longer hold an Arab citizenship and am living outside of the Arab region?

No. For this fellowship program citizenship from an Arab country or proof of residence (in the case of 'citizenless' refugees) in an Arab country is required.

Am I eligible to apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship if I am not from an Arab country however I am a specialist interested and working on the Arab region?

No. Unfortunately the ACSS Early Career Fellowship is not open for this category of researchers.

Institutional Affiliation and Mentorship

Should I affiliate myself to a particular institution within the region during the ACSS Early Career Fellowship?

Yes. It is a must that you seek the formal approval for an affiliation with an institution in the region that would cover the duration of your fellowship. You should also provide a letter from the hosting institution addressed to the Arab Council for the Social Sciences expressing the institution's willingness to host you during the period of the fellowship.

Does the institution have to be located within the region?

Yes.

Does the institution have to be Arab?

Yes and no. Though it is a must that the institution(s) in question be located in the Arab region, this can include foreign or international institutions based in the region. The reasons given by the applicant for the importance of seeking a particular international or foreign institution over an Arab one will be evaluated case by case by the ACSS and the Selection Committee. It should be noted that preference is still given to Arab institutions.

Should it be a purely academic institution? What if I work on civil society and would like to affiliate myself to a civil society institution during my Early Career Fellowship?

Yes and no. Since the aim of the Early Career Fellows Program is to advance the academic career of the applicant, priority is given to academic institutions. Yet, in exceptional cases where you clearly explain the importance of a non-academic affiliation, the request may be approved. In such cases, however, you must have an academic mentor, whether from the same institution or another academic institution within the same country where you will be based for the majority of the time of your fellowship.

I am currently affiliated and work at an academic institution in the region. Can I remain in my institution during the period of my fellowship?

No, we do not encourage research fellows to remain within the same institution where they have been working prior to the ACSS Early Career Fellowship. Mobility is a must for this type of fellowship, and we particularly encourage applicants who plan to move to another institution in the region other than the one they are currently affiliated with. Applicants who have a tenure-track/tenured position *in* the region, however, may be considered provided that they take a leave for the period of the fellowship and affiliate themselves with a different institution. In **very exceptional cases**, where the research fellow holds a tenure-track/tenured position at a university in the region and cannot take leave (for reasons related to his/her rank and/or promotion), his/her application may be considered. Applicants in doubt in this regard are advised to contact the ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit (at grants@theacss.org) prior to submitting their application.

What is the expected role of my mentor?

The most important role of the mentor is to integrate the research fellow in the academic community and network at the institution where the fellow will be affiliated during his/her fellowship. Additionally, the mentor would be expected to provide academic advice, guidance and supervision to the Fellow and is expected to submit periodical reports on the progress of the Fellow to the ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit. The mentor receives a compensation for his/her involvement with the ACSS research fellow.

Where should the mentor be based?

The mentor must be based in the institution of affiliation of the Fellow.

Will the ACSS Secretariat be communicating directly with the mentor prior and during my ACSS Early Career Fellowship?

Yes. Upon shortlisting, the ACSS will be contacting the mentor with the terms and conditions of their commitment. Upon selection, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) will be signed with the mentor.

Application Process

How do I apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship?

Applicants must [fill out a profile page on the ACSS applications platform](#) and submit an online application. The application form will be available as of November 30, 2021.

It is not possible for me to submit an online application due to technical difficulties. Does this mean I cannot apply for the ACSS Early Career Fellowship?

No. In extenuating circumstances the ACSS will accept an application sent via email or post. If you wish to discuss these options, you must contact ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit (at grants@theacss.org) well in advance of the February 24, 2022 deadline to obtain additional instructions on how to submit an application via email or post.

When will I know the result of my application?

Decisions will be communicated to applicants during the first week of May 2022.

What are the attachments that I am expected to submit with my application?

Applicants need to submit with their applications the following documents:

- 1) A proof of nationality or residence in the Arab World**
- 2) A detailed CV including publications**
- 3) A cover Letter**
- 4) A project proposal (between 10-15 pages).** *Please note that all submitted proposals will be checked and reviewed by the ACSS on a plagiarism detection website.*
- 5) A letter from a mentor based in a regional academic institution**
- 6) A detailed CV of the proposed mentor.**
- 7) A letter from the hosting institution**

The applicant should expect to be contacted by the ACSS Secretariat in case further details or information are needed with regards to the above documents. Applications missing any of the above documents will not be forwarded to the Selection Committee.

When is the deadline for the 8th cycle of the ACSS Early Career Fellowship?

You must complete and submit your online application before 11:00 pm (Beirut Time) on February 24, 2022. In case you face any technical problems using the [online application system](#), make sure to email all the requirements to grants@theacss.org before the deadline.

Do I need to complete the online application all at once?

No. You may return to the online application as many times as necessary between November 30, 2021 and February 24, 2022. Be sure to save your work after you finish each section of the application – the online application will contain detailed instructions on how to do this. Once the application has been submitted, you will no longer be able to alter the information.

Do I need to provide written references?

No. You need to provide names and contact details for at least two academic referees. You do not need to provide written reference letters at the application stage.

How will I know that my application is complete?

After you have successfully submitted your application, you will receive an automated confirmation email from the ACSS.

Can I ask for feedback on my application before submission?

Yes and no. The ACSS will provide you with general feedback on whether your application fulfils eligibility requirements and specific issues regarding the application materials requested. However, you will not be provided with feedback on the content and quality of your application and of your narrative proposal.

What should I expect once my application has been submitted?

The ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit will carry out an initial review of applications to determine eligibility and eliminate incomplete applications. Eligible applications are then sent to the Selection Committee for evaluation. During the initial review phase, the ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit may contact applicants to inquire about any missing information and/or documents.

How will my application be evaluated?

Applications received will be first reviewed for eligibility by the ACSS Secretariat. You will be asked to provide any missing documents during the initial review phase. Disqualified applicants will be rejected at this phase. Qualified applications will then be sent to members of the Selection Committee for review and evaluation. The Selection Committee is composed of five senior scholars from across the Arab region with diverse social science backgrounds, who will be asked to provide an objective evaluation of the applications. The Selection Committee will then meet to discuss each application, rank them and select the best applicants on the basis of both merit and promise.

What are the criteria according to which my application will be assessed?

The evaluation criteria that will be used to evaluate the applicant's application can be summed in the following:

- **Research Proposal's Contribution to Knowledge (30%):**

- Evaluations will be based on the following:
 - Research questions (10%)
 - Significance (5%)
 - Quality (10%)
 - Originality (5%)
- **Feasibility of Proposed Research Plan (20%)**
 - Is the timeframe realistic? (10%)
 - Are the methods and plans proposed appropriate for the aims of the project? (10%)
- **The Candidate's Competency (15%)**
 - Evaluations will be based on the following:
 - Academic credentials (5%)
 - Existing publications (5%)
 - Potential (5%)
- **The Candidate's Postdoctoral Plan (25%):**
 - Evaluations will be based on the following:
 - Choice of mentor (10%)
 - Institutional affiliation (5%)
 - Plans for conducting research during the pandemic (10%)
- **Expected Outputs (10%):**
 - Evaluations will be based on the following:
 - Planned Publications (5%)
 - Career Plan (5%)

If my application is not successful, will I receive feedback as to why my proposal was not selected?

No. Unfortunately, we are unable to provide feedback on unsuccessful applications. Only accepted applications as well as those that receive a 'revise and resubmit' decision will receive feedback on their applications. The latter will be encouraged to resubmit an application in the following cycle.

Fellowship Details

What happens after I am selected for a fellowship?

Successful applicants will receive provisional acceptance letters confirming their selection and, if applicable, requests for clarification and elaboration from the Selection Committee. The ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit will contact the proposed mentor(s), explain to them their terms and conditions of their work with the successful applicant and ask them to sign a Memorandum of Understanding to formalize their commitment with the Council. After that, a contract will be sent to the applicant detailing the terms of the fellowship, including deadlines for reporting and required activities and outputs.

Do I have any reporting obligations upon being awarded the fellowship?

Yes. Selected applicants will be expected to provide three periodic narrative reports on their work and progress dispersed over the 12-month period of their fellowship. Mentors will have the same reporting obligations as the Fellows, where they will be asked to report on the progress of their Fellows and provide any details on any concerns that may arise.

Do I have to attend events organized by the ACSS upon receiving the fellowship?

Yes. The Early Career Fellow is expected to participate in at least three events during his/her fellowship term, unless there are compelling reasons that prevent them from doing so. All expenses of attending such events will be covered separately by the ACSS and will not come out of the fellowship budget.

Do I have any other obligations upon receiving the fellowship?

In addition to attending at least two events, the ACSS requires each research fellow to submit one working paper to its Working Paper series during the 9th month of the fellowship (see this [page](#) for submissions guidelines). The series is a pre-publication outlet that enables dissemination of work supported by the ACSS in the region and beyond. The Fellow retains the rights to the paper, which can then be submitted for publication in a journal or a book of the Fellow's choosing.

When must I conclude my work under the ACSS Early Career Fellowship if I am selected for funding?

The ACSS Early Career Fellowship is for 12 months from the date chosen by the applicant as the starting date for their fellowship. All fellowship activities must be completed by the end of the 12-month fellowship period.

What does the ACSS Early Career Fellowship amount to?

The fellowship will provide for 12 months of full support (living expenses plus research expenses) with a total stipend ranging between \$20,000 and \$36,000. This amount will depend on the respective price levels in the proposed country/countries of residence where the fellow will be residing during his/her fellowship as well as whether or not the applicant will be having other sources of income and/or funding throughout the fellowship period. If shortlisted, applicants will be asked to provide a budget estimating (1) the costs of living, (2) the costs of research, and (3) indicating whether or not they will be having any other sources of funding and/or income during the period of their fellowship.

In agreement with the research fellow, the funds will be disbursed in four payments upon the delivery of detailed periodic narrative reports.

What does the ACSS Early Career Fellowship cover?

The ACSS Early Career Fellowship is meant to cover the living and research expenses of the fellow during their fellowship period. Before being offered the fellowship, applicants will be asked to indicate whether or not they will have any other sources of funding and/or income during the period of their fellowship. If the applicants will have any other sources of income and/or funding during their fellowship period, the ACSS may decide to deduct the equivalent amount of this income or funding from their fellowship monies. In principle, fellows are not allowed to accumulate sources of funding/income.

Can I retain my work or take on consultancies during the period of the fellowship?

No, fellows are not allowed to have a full-time or part-time job during the period of the fellowship. However, fellows are allowed to undertake short-term consultancies or part-time teaching. But they may not generate earnings for these activities that exceed US\$3,000 (three thousand US dollars) during the entire period of the fellowship (i.e. a maximum remuneration of US\$3,000 over twelve months).

Furthermore, the fellows may not teach more than one course during the 12-month period of the fellowship. Exceptions to these guidelines could be made on a case-by-case basis.

I am applying for multiple fellowships/grants. Should I be awarded the ACSS Fellowship, can I also accept funding from other sources?

Yes and no. In case the Fellow is offered any other funding from any other sources, he/she is obliged to communicate the exact terms and conditions of the offer to the ACSS Secretariat and seek approval. The ACSS will examine the offer and reach an agreement with the Fellow that is to his/her best interest. In principle, the Fellow cannot accept any funding from any other organization for the same research project or items covered by the ACSS during the fellowship period. In case the second offer covers the same research project or items as those covered by the ACSS, the Fellow may then have to choose between the two fellowships. Additionally, fellows are not allowed to undertake two concurrent fellowships at the same time of the ACSS fellowship. The ACSS will contact the other funding agency to make sure that the terms are clear to all sides.

Will the ACSS share the information submitted in the proposal with other bodies?

By submitting the application, you are granting the ACSS at its own discretion the right to share information with other institutions (including donor agencies) on your research title, objectives, location and the researchers' contact information. In case of compelling circumstances limited exceptions can be made on a case-by-case basis in this regard.

It should be also noted that upon selection the name, bio, the title of your research project and abstract will be posted on the ACSS website as part of the ACSS' commitment to transparency towards its stakeholders. As the ACSS develops its website and other forms of dissemination and communication, Fellows will be invited to contribute essays, articles, abstracts and other material related to their research. The applicant should contact the ACSS Grants and Fellowships Unit (at grants@theacss.org) in case he/she does not wish to share particular information at any point of the process due to compelling reasons.
